

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES Tuesday, August 22, 2023 at 6:30 p.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER

A. The General Meeting was held in the cafeteria on Tuesday, August 22, 2023 at Miller's Point Elementary School. The Miller's Point Neighborhood Association General Meeting was called to order by President, Gwendolyn Bolden at 6:30 p.m.

II. ROLL CALL | ESTABLISH QUORUM

- A. There were eighteen in attendance. Quorum were met. Present were Board Officers Gwendolyn Bolden, Shawanda Fowler, and Cindy Nutt. Committee members present were Jason Clark from the Social Media Committee, and Kamie Clark from the Marketing Committee.
- B. Acknowledged special guest speakers present Commissioner Calvert from Precinct 4, Director of Community Engagement Ramon Chapa, Jr., Operational Services Alvaro "Tony" Vasquez, and Public Works Assistant Superintendent Johnny Luna, Public Works Superintendent Aaron Martinez with Bexar County.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Approved Minutes of General Meeting, Tuesday, April 18, 2023.

A motion was made by Lisa Hunt to approve General Meeting, Tuesday, April 18th, 2023. Beverly Comstock seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

IV. BEXAR COUNTY COMMISSIONER AND PUBLIC WORKS

A. President Gwendolyn Bolden introduced Commissioner Tommy Calvert from Bexar County Precinct 4. Commissioner Calvert stated our President Gwendolyn has been working on a proposal for a little funding for the next couple of months while they iron out the rules and regulations with CPS Energy so we can begin installations of the SOLAR lights. At the National Night Out Meeting, Tuesday, September 19, 2023, he will provide us another update. Tony explained the funding is there and the agreement is there at the attorney's office. Once they work out an agreement, they will be ready to roll. Johnny from Public Works discussed how to report damaged traffic signs, sidewalk issues, speed bumps, health and safety issues in the neighborhood like trash pile outside home. Johnny provided a flyer on how to prevent mosquitoes #FightTheBiteSA. He gave out mosquito dunks and mosquito repellent. Johnny stated they have tested and found one West Niles close to this area.

V. BOARD REPORTS

- A. **President.** Gwendolyn Bolden highlighted the 2023 General Meetings are scheduled for (Sept. 19th and Oct. 17th) and mentioned our meeting signs are missing. There will be a Board Meeting scheduled in the next two weeks. Gwen communicated we need volunteers for our upcoming 2023 National Night Out.
- B. **Vice President.** Shawanda highlighted membership dues are due now and our annual membership dues are \$30 per household. Online payments for membership dues and donations can be made through our website via PayPal or Cash app cash.app/\$millerspointna using your smartphone or tablet.
- C. **Treasurer.** On behalf of Magdalena, Gwendolyn Bolden reported a financial report of expenses and bank balance. As of August 22, we have a bank ending balance of \$5,326.55 with a debt of \$2,071.68 for the streetlights not paid since November 2022.

A. **Marketing Committee.** Kamie provided an update on a discussion she had with Tiger. Tiger Sanitation has special prices and services for HOA's and since we qualify under HOA guidelines, even though we are not a

B. **CPS Energy.** Gwendolyn requested an update from Commissioner Calvert for next Tuesday's meeting on September 19, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. to speak about the SOLAR lights progress at the attorney's office.


